A Flipped Classroom

A pedagogical model where the typical lecture and homework elements are reversed

Flipped Model

| | Traditional model | Flipped model |

| In Class | Lectures Teacher: Delivers information Student: Passive recipient | Active Learning Teacher: One-on- One, Mentor, Facilitator Student: Active participant |

| Outside Class | Homework Usually reading assignments, problems, papers | Homework Videotaped lectures, podcasts, readings, eResources |

Why bother?

- O Advance work
 - Allows students to work at their own pace, repeat as needed
- O In class
 - O Increased engagement
 - O Collaboration, peer instruction
 - O Time
 - Frees class time for deeper learning
 - O Personal interaction
 - O Quality time with students
